Porcelain tiles of different sizes may be combined to create interesting modular patterns and designs. Although modular tile layouts are not essentially difficult, there are some things that must be taken into consideration before beginning the installation.

First and foremost is the determination of quantities of each size. Keep in mind that the percentages typically expressed in pattern books refer to the square foot coverage of a particular size not the percentage of required tiles. For example, an 18" X 18" tile is 2.25 square feet and 4.45 tiles would cover a ten square foot area; on the other hand, a 6" X 6" tile is only .25 square feet and will require 40 tiles to cover the ten square foot area.

The tile setter must always check the caliber of each size of tile. Caliber is the facial dimension size of a particular tile. Based on a scale of 3 through 7, the caliber is printed on the carton label. Ideally, all of the tiles of the same shape and size should have the same caliber number, or minimally only one caliber number away, i.e. caliber 5 & 6 may be used not 5 & 7. When installing modular layouts it's important that the various tile sizes have similar calibers. The width of the grout line may need to be adjusted to accommodate the dimensions of a modular design.

Additionally, the tile setter should dry lay a complete design pattern out to determine the actual dimension of the pattern repeat. It is this overall dimension that should be used in determining a "balanced" layout.

Modular designs continue to grow in popularity and the professional tile setter must have a thorough understanding of the intricacies of this installation process.
